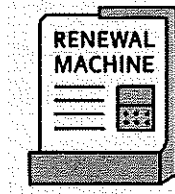

When I worked for a Japanese company many years ago, one lunchtime I wanted to tell my \*female colleagues about a delicious ramen place I had recently been. The problem was, I never got to describe the food as they were all shocked and maybe even a little concerned when I told them I had gone by myself.

\*As our conversation progressed, I realised it wasn't the ramen shop's location that worried them. I learned that, at least in the late 2000s, ramen shops had the reputation of being places where only men went by themselves. "Are those men dangerous?" I asked. "No," they replied. "But don't you feel uncomfortable surrounded by men?" I thought about the male customers at the shop I went to. Sure, some were noisily eating their food, but everyone just \*kept to themselves. It wasn't like I was alone at a bar.

I might be in the \*minority, but I quite like going to places to eat by myself for a bit of "me time." I can't order as many things, but I can focus on what I have ordered. I don't need to think about whether my \*dining companion is enjoying their meal or not. When I go somewhere by myself, it's also for research — I can see if I want to come back again with others.

In Japan, some restaurant search websites allow you to search for places "good for solo dining." This sometimes means you get less comfortable seating. What I like however, is when women ignore that filter and dine by themselves wherever they want. One time when I was at a fine dining restaurant with my partner, we saw an older woman happily eating multiple courses by herself. This was quite unusual and we wondered what her story was.

In other countries, solo dining might invite unwanted conversations. But in Japan, I like that everyone tends to respect other diners' spaces, especially if they're on their own. One such restaurant where this happens is in my neighbourhood. When I first moved here, I saw an Italian restaurant with two women working behind the counter. I started going after work and noticed that often when I was there, Eric Carmen's All by Myself would start playing. I always found the timing of the song \*hilarious. My partner and I have since become regulars and friends with the owner.

While Eric Carmen's \*power ballad is mournful and sad, the times I've dined alone have never felt that way. If you think maybe there's a restaurant out there you've been dying to check out by yourself, why not give it a go? You might find some much needed "me time" when you're all by yourself.

My friend returned from a recent trip to Tokyo with a largely empty suitcase. She'd \*stowed her things in her companions' baggage because her suitcase handles were broken.

The top handle broke on the first day of her trip. One day later, the side handle gave way too. Having decided to buy a new one, she asked the hotel staff how to \*dispose of it.

Their answer made her change her mind.

She'd have to pay ¥2,000 for the hotel to handle it. My friend found that too expensive, so she brought her suitcase, broken handles and all, back to Singapore to throw away. Never mind that it had become difficult to carry around even with hardly anything inside.

"I knew it's not easy to find \*rubbish bins in Japan," she said. "But I didn't expect to have to pay ¥2,000 to throw something away."

While \*mulling over what to do, a horrible thought crossed her mind. She \*contemplated leaving it in a locker at the train station.

My look of horror surprised her. "Would it have been that bad?" she asked. "They can simply throw it away with the rest of the trash."

I said her suitcase could have ended up occupying precious space in \*the lost and found section, not to mention the time and effort spent by the staff.

For many visitors to Japan, it can be difficult to understand the rules of \*rubbish disposal.

First, you have to sort your trash — a practice which isn't mandatory in Singapore. Many friends have asked me to explain the difference between \*combustibles and non-combustibles.

Then there's the matter of paying to throw away \*bulky items. My friends were shocked to know I had to pay a few thousand yen to throw away a mattress when I was living in Kyoto.

In Singapore, we can get it done for free by calling the town council which manages our estate. Some town councils impose \*a quota of two bulky items per household per month. That can include anything from a fridge to a sofa.

Unfortunately, because it's so easy to throw something away in Singapore, many people don't think twice about buying new stuff. If we had to pay a fee, I think many Singaporeans will be more mindful about their shopping.

Everything comes at a cost. So before I buy something, I try to think of the effort it would take to re-home or recycle it if I no longer want it. Just because we don't pay a fee doesn't mean it's cost-free. It simply means the costs are hidden and \*borne by taxpayers and the environment.

The more we consume and throw away, the greater the price we pay, even if it doesn't come directly from our pocket.
